After all of the doubt over the effect of the FMD crisis, it was good news indeed to see the restrictions removed sufficiently far to be able to organise 2001's modified Scafell Pike. Yet again the weather gave us its blessing and, although looking a bit clagged-in as I drove up the valley, conditions improved progressively with a few hundred feet of mist clinging to the summit, dramatising Lord's Rake as it rose, pouring over the top of the crags. There was virtually no wind on the ground so we erected our new gazebo registration tent with confidence and I relented on the gear requirement to just a cagoule etc. Just as last year, the runners had to sweat it out on the ascent. Ian Holmes from Bingley came in first but it looked to be an interesting duel on the descent of Lingmell Nose and the diagonal path with runner-up Borrowdale's Simon Booth and Mark Roberts. It was actually Rob Jeb, also from Bingley who gained the summit first by almost a minute but unfortunately turned his ankle on the descent, coming in 51st (hope the injury was not too serious). The 3rd place was claimed by Mark Roberts, also from Borrowdale and only 12 seconds covered the first 3 runners. A marvellous run by George Crayston Jnr. from CFR at the age of 18 brought him in 6th place so a special under 20 prize was awarded for this outstanding achievement. Horwich RMI's Graham Schofield won the V40 category ahead of Borrowdale's Steve Hicks and 3rd man David Armstrong from NFR. The V45 class was headed up by CFR's Rob James, 2nd Irvine Block, also from CFR and 3rd Dave Bateson running for Achilles Ratti. The V50 class was won by Ken Taylor from Rossendale, and 2nd counter was Clayton's Jack Holt with 3rd going to club mate Mick Targette. The V55 category was won by John Crummet from Todmorden ahead of Achilles Ratti's Bill Mitton. The V60 winner was Barry Johnson from CFR with the runner-up being club mate Joe Richardson and 3rd going to George Barrow from Todmorden. CFR's Harry Catlow (at 69) claimed the V65 prize in 75th place. The ladies' race was won with a tremendous result of 16th overall in a field of 76 by Keswick's Louise Sharp, the runner up being club mate Hilde Krynen. 3rd place went to Bingley's Sharon Taylor. The LV40 category was won by Jane Smith from Todmorden, 2nd place going to club mate Mandy Goth and 3rd to Jane Hornsby from Black Combe. There was no ladies team prize (3 required to count) so please ladies, let's have a few more runners next year! The Jack and Jill prize was won by Louise and Nick Sharp - total 20 points. There were no retirements. The Gents' team prize was won by Borrowdale who achieved a total of only 20 points! Lets hope the race can return to its original course in 2002. I hope you all found the flapjacks to your taste - all disappeared this time but Maggie said the crumbs were nice! I also hope my attempts at brewing were passable and that you eventually will savour the prizes. For those of you that are patient, the longer you leave the beer the better. This was the first time I had been on Ilkley Moor and I was impressed how attractive it is for walking or running. The fine weather, after an overcast morning back home, definitely helped. The race itself is similar to the Shepherds Skyline of a week previously, though shorter. It is mostly either narrow tracks that are difficult to overtake on (and alternatively, easy to elbow your rivals into the bracken as they try to overtake), or wider, boulder-strewn tracks that require a lot of ground-watching. Like the Shepherds Skyline, the Ilkley Moor race route also leads you up onto the moor, then sadistically takes you down back towards the finish area before heading back onto the moor again. Having said that I thoroughly enjoyed the race. I'm not convinced that the route is only 4.5 miles, though - it felt like a lot further!

The route was well marked except for one path junction close to the end of the race. Half the runners took the correct short route (and for once that included me!) and the other half took the longer route. Since this was all in sight of the finish area, it made for good viewing of either frustrated or relieved runners. There is a definite sadistic streak in Ilkley!

Pudsey & Bramley were out in force and had 6 runners in the first 12, with Rob Hope and Phil Sheard leading the way. The winning lady, Mary Wilkinson (any relation Jez/John?) flew past me and the 4 runners in front of me, down the final hill. A very impressive descent from her.
