Well done to everyone - a good effort by all.

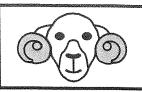
CALDERDALE WAY RELAY

If you read The Long Walks (Richard Gilbert???) he describes the Rhinns Of Kells circuit, the race is basically a shortened version missing out the Rhinns. I must admit this was probably the best course I have vet run and the race deserves more support that it gets. Jon Underwood

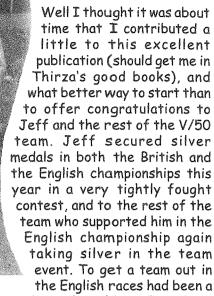
