



## Ludd Valley Selfie-Score

### Course Notes

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Ludd Valley is a charming and picturesque corner of Calder Valley, somewhat off the beaten track and perhaps not visited as frequently as some of the other more well-known parts, such as Hardcastle Crag and Crag Vale, but well worth your attention, nonetheless.

Once home to ITV's *In Loving Memory* the valley boasts a couple of traditional pubs in the Lord Nelson in the village, and The Cat it' Well at Saltonstall. Both excellent Taylor's pubs and where a warm welcome awaits.

The recent addition of Bob's Tea Rooms near Jerusalem Farm has added a new dimension to the upper end of the valley, and they provide splendid tea, coffee and cakes.

The course takes you to the upper end of the valley to Castle Carr to the north, along the east side up to Wainstalls & Warley, then skirts Midgley moor to the west. Plus you will visit the picturesque village of Luddenden itself, often a finalist in Yorkshire in Bloom. There's no shortage of climb and descent and you should enjoy a lung-busting 90 minutes or so.

Please use the paths and trails where you can and stay off the roads.

1. Bob's Tea Room, Dry Carr Lane (limited parking)
2. Jerusalem Farm, Jerusalem Lane (small car park)
3. Luddenden Car Park, Luddenden Village (decent sized car park)
4. The Cat it' Well, Saltonstall (decent sized car park)
5. The Crossroads inn, Wainstalls (decent sized car park)
